Early In-Person Voting Sites Available For Registered Voters

Calhoun County Clerk and Register of Deeds Kimberly A. Hinkley is reminding voters that Early In-Person Voting will be available ahead of the **Tuesday, August 4, 2026, Primary Election.**



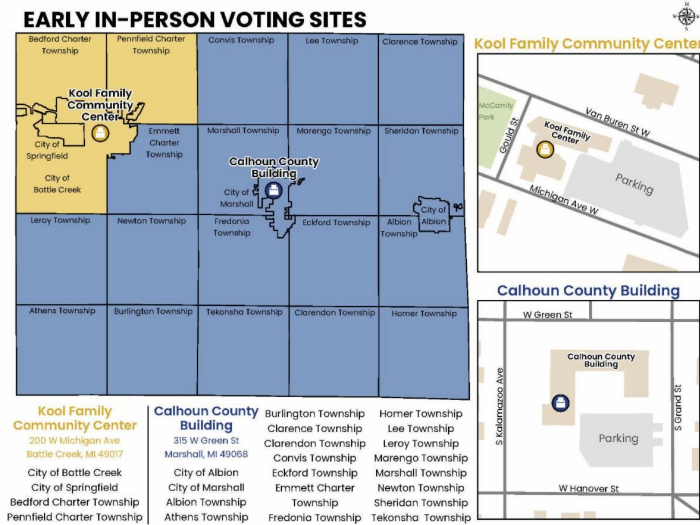
Approved by Michigan voters through Proposal 22-2, Early In-Person Voting allows registered voters to cast their ballot in person before Election Day.

For the August 4 Primary Election, Early In-Person Voting will be available for nine consecutive days, **Saturday, July 25, through Sunday, August 2, 2026.**

Voters who have received an absentee ballot may also choose to cast that ballot in person by placing it directly into a tabulator at their designated Early In-Person Voting Site.

Please note that voting on Election Day, Tuesday, August 4, will continue to take place at each voter's regular polling location, not at an Early In-Person Voting Site.

There are two Early In-Person Voting Sites serving Calhoun County. Voters should attend the site designated for the municipality in which they are registered.
